

## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE Hamilton Jr. Wins at Track of His Father and Grandfather

*Meridian, ID – July, 22, 2016 –* The Royal Purple King of the Wing National Sprintcar Series kicked off its Northwest tour Thursday night at the 65-year-old <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> mile oval located in downtown Meridian, ID. Nineteen of the premier payment sprintcar drivers in North America were greeted with triple digit temperatures and a fast track.

Surry British Columbia native, Aaron Willison, reset the Royal Purple King of the Wing Meridian Speedway Track record with a 11.458 second lap. Unfortunately, he was plagued by mechanical issues and retired early from the forty lap main event.

Willison drew a 10 pill to determine the invert. This put Robbie Price and Tristen Spiers on the front row for the feature. Price sputtered at the green flag as Spiers' pulled away from the field. Price did a great job controlling is ailing machine around the quarter mile oval as the field expertly moved around him and he could exit after completing 1 lap without incident.

The caution flag only flew once during this feature. Something broke on the sprinter of Sierra Jackson on the 17<sup>th</sup> circuit. She hit the wall in turn 1. Fluid on the track sent Eric Humphries around. After a short cleanup, Spiers led the field to the green. Within 6 laps he was lapping the slower cars. Davey Hamilton Jr. and Bryan Warf were close behind. Lapped traffic came in to play in the closing laps. The slower cars stayed low allowing the leaders to pass cleaning but on the tight track going 3 wide was not an option for Hamilton or Warf. Spiers took the checkers.

Officials of the Royal Purple King of the Wing National Sprincar Series announced that after the required post-race inspection of the top 3 finishers, the car of driver Tristen Spiers failed the inspection with an engine rule infraction. That infraction dropped him to last place finish and Davey Hamilton Jr. was awarded the win with second going to Bryan Warf, and third to Robert Beck.
