Bobby Santos Wins Southeast Championship

April 15, 2019 – Mountain Home, ID, The King of the Wing (KotW) Series kicked off its 2019 campaign at 5 Flags Speedway Friday, April 12th. Bobby Santos from Franklyn, MA was quickest around the ½ mile oval with a 13.812 second lap. Chowcillia, California's Eric Humphries was close behind with a 13.990. Idaho native Mike Anderson made the 2500-mile tow to Pensacola to a catastrophic engine failure in the first lap.

Heat Races were won by Shane Butler and Humphries while Santos won the 30-lap feature event.

On Saturday morning all competitors traveled 160 miles north to Montgomery, AL and the Montgomery Motor Speedway. Humphries and Santos again battled for the top qualifying spot with Humphries turning a 15,927. Santos was a tick slower coming in with a 16.090.

Mississippi's Brandon Blendon won heat 1 wile Santos was heat race 2 winner. Santos took no time to get to the lead in the 30-lap main event. Butler ran 2nd with Humphries staying close in 3rd. The battle for 2nd place let Santos lead widen lap after lap. With just 2 laps to go Humphries completed the pass for 2nd, but the gap to Santos was too much to overcome in this feature event that stayed green the entire 30-laps.

When all points for the weekend were tallied Santos came out on top and was crowned the Southeast Tour Champion.
