Season Finale Weekend November 9th and 10th

Oct 15, 2019 – Mountain Home, ID – The King of the Wing finale weekend of 2019 is fast approaching. The venues are the same however they have swapped dates. Kern County Raceway Park (KCRP) is now Saturday November 9th with the season finale at Irwindale Speedway on Sunday November 10th.

Both races will be afternoon races. The gates will open at 10 am at KCRP with the first practice at 2 pm. Qualifying will begin at 5 pm. Wingless 360 Sprintcars and POWRi/BCRA Midgets will race on the dirt track at the conclusion of our race.

Irwindale's schedule for the Sunday race was not available at press time. Times will be posted on the KotW website when they become available.

There will be no practice on Friday November 8th. There is an opportunity to get a little track time on the KCRP ½ mile on October 26th. KCRP would let to put on a demo during there regular schedule that night teams that take advantage of this opportunity will be given 2- 15 minute practice session and 1 exhibition session right before their feature event. This is the only pavement Sprintcar Series that features competitors from across the United States and Canada. Since its inception in 2014 the series has run 44 races at 17 different tracks. A total of 173 different drivers have competed with an average of 23 cars at every race. Total purse money over the 4 years is over \$858,000.
